Giuseppe Sormani International Prize for works on Pier Paolo Pasolini

Third Edition

Terms and conditions

Fondazione Istituto Piemontese A. Gramsci presents the third edition of the Sormani Prize dedicated to Pier Paolo Pasolini.

1. The competition is opened to printed works (monographs or essays, published in scientific magazines or included in collective works) by Italian and foreign researchers (in the original language) published from 2015 to the date of publication of the competition announcement, and unpublished works on the poetry, non-fiction, theatre and films produced by Pier Paolo Pasolini. Particular attention will be reserved to the theme of Democracy and control (how are the dynamics of control combined in a society based on the principle of freedom and individual self-determination? When are they instruments suitable to the democratic regime? When do they embody or replicate mechanisms of oppression - with reference to Pasolini's thought - bourgeois or capitalist? When the refusal of responsibility towards others represents an instrument of inequity and false self-determination?).
2. Candidates are asked to send a printed copy, if available, and an electronic copy of the work (volume or essay, or score, or film) to the Secretary's Office of Fondazione Istituto Piemontese A. Gramsci, located in Via del Carmine, 14, 10122 Torino (Italy), within 15th July 2022 with the indication 'Premio Sormani' in the subject line and on the envelope or package, as well as the complete address with telephone and e-mail and, separately, a brief curriculum. The same data and the electronic copy must be sent by e-mail to the address premiosormani@gramscitorino.it.

3. If the work is written in a language different from: Italian, French, English, Portuguese, Spanish and German, the candidate must send a translation of the work in one of these languages.
4. The jury may award up to two prizes, one of them to a young beginner's work. If there is only a winner, they will be entitled to the full amount of 3,000 euros. If there are two winners, €2,000 will be given to the beginner to support his work's publication.
5. The Prize will be awarded during a public ceremony organised by the Foundation in Turin within December 2022. The Foundation will provide for all the costs of only the winners.
